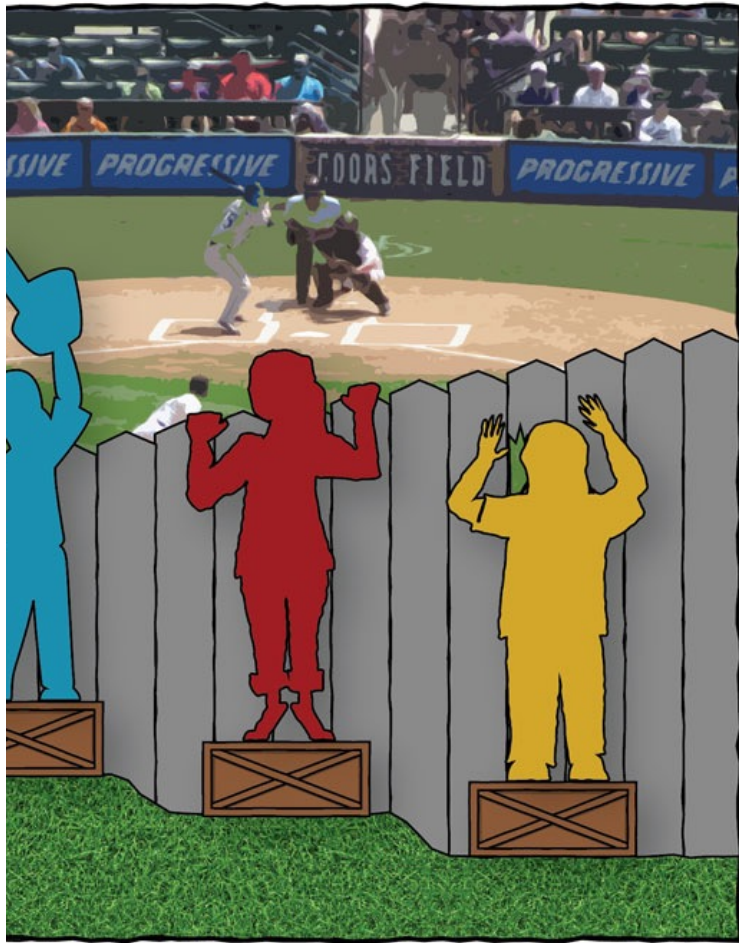

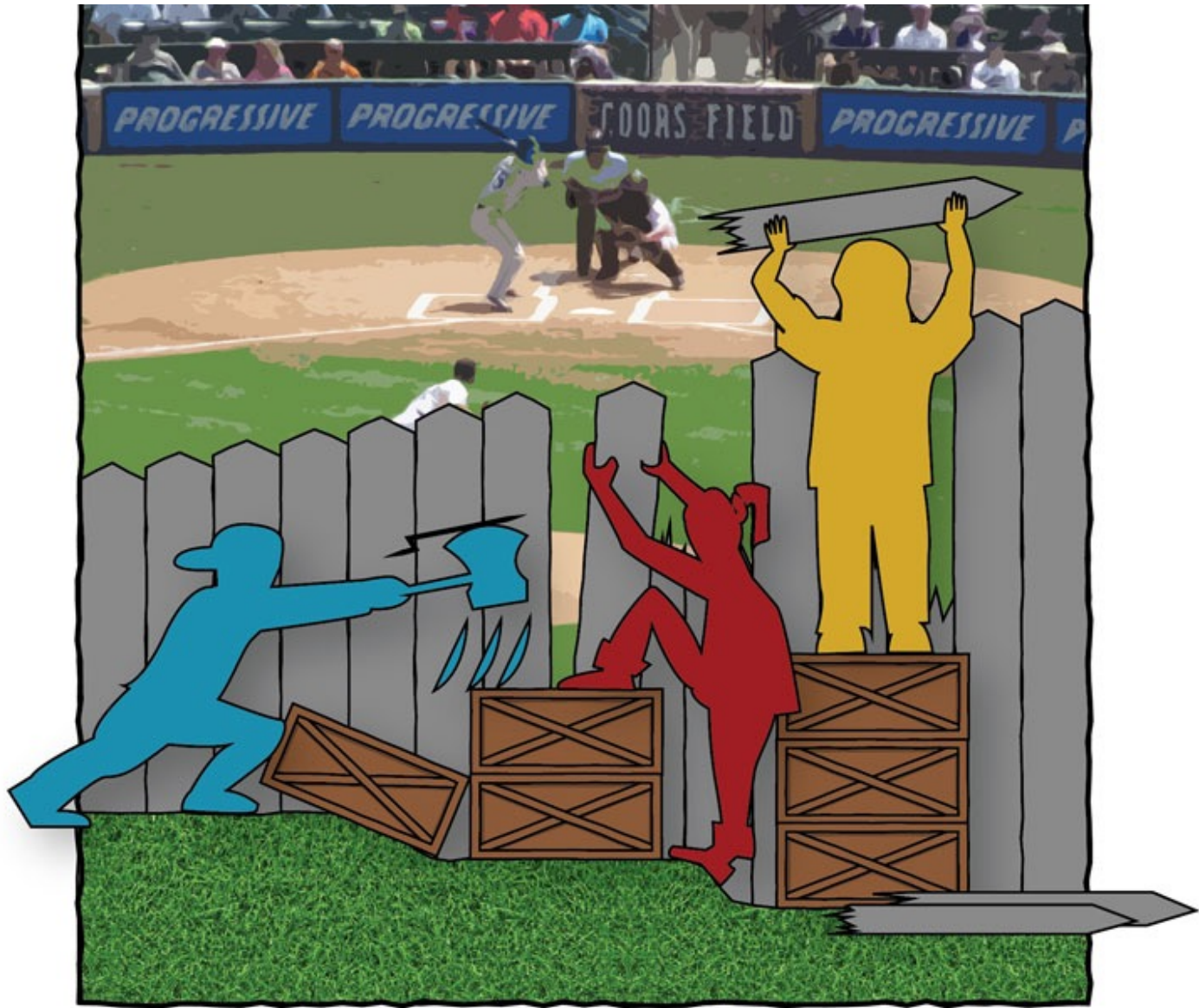

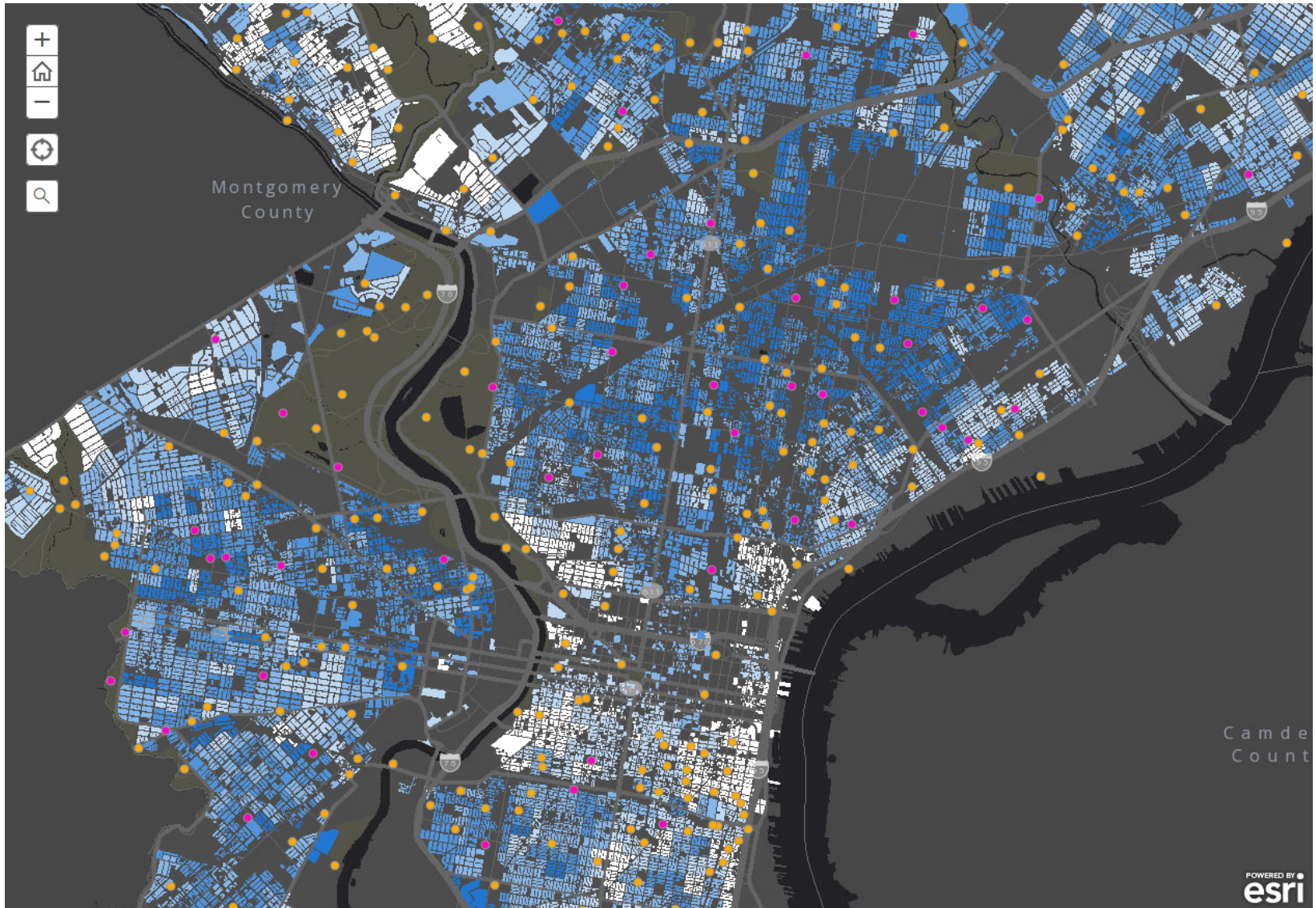

Historic Powelton Village

206 N. 35th St: Underground Railroad and Walter J. Lear, Health Official, Activist

This home is rumored to have been a stop on the Underground Railroad; according to records, Philadelphia's abolitionists helped more than 100 slaves escape every year in the decade before the Civil War. The property's progressive nature continued in the modern era, as it was home to Walter Lear, the first openly gay Philadelphian to hold public office. Lear was Philadelphia's deputy health commissioner in the 1960s and regional health commissioner for the Pennsylvania Department of Health. He came out in 1976 to emphasize "the need for better medical treatment for gays." Lear was a gay rights activist, and fought for health care access for all. He helped found the William Way Center, the Philadelphia AIDS Task Force, the Maternity Care Coalition, and convened the first national conference on AIDS in the 1980s.
